

TRIAD HYDROPHILIC WOUND DRESSING

A prescription is <u>not</u> required

Triad provides a moist wound environment, targets wounds and debrides them, & protects surrounding skin from excess drainage. Ideal for difficult-to-dress wounds with light-to-moderate drainage.

- Remove old dressings and <u>lightly</u> clean wound with Wound Cleanser or soap/water or take a shower
 - o Do NOT scrub off hardened cream, just lightly clean
 - You may clean the wound <u>daily</u> (LOTS of drainage) to <u>every third day</u> (NO drainage). If outer dressing is wet, CHANGE IT
- Apply a layer of Triad (thickness of a dime) directly on the wound
 - It is absolutely fine if cream gets on healthy surrounding tissue & if you apply new cream on top of old
- Cover with an outer dressing, as needed
 - o The paste will harden; No outer dressing is needed unless there is drainage.
- The amount of drainage dictates how often the dressing should be changed. We recommend at least every 3rd day, but more often as the dressing is soiled by drainage
 - Do NOT apply new cream over old cream. Too much build up can create pressure and can cause new wounds
